

Very neat deep-black pile (like a queen lapidarius); bright yellow tail-flashes when fresh but bleaching out when older (right image); collar darker and usually narrower; never with a paler scutellum fringe. Large, size of a queen lapidarius.

## Bombus bohemicus



Slightly smaller and fluffier than vestalis; collar paler \& broader; weak scutellum fringe can be present; tail-flashes pale yellow when fresh but rapidly bleaching out (right image) to create an appearance more like sy/vestris but longer, flatter \& less fluffy.

## Bombus sylvestris



Smaller, rounder \& fluffier; tail strongly downcurved.

## Bombus barbutellus



Larger with pale-haired scutellum; top of head pale-haired too.

## Bombus campestris



Tail buff-haired at sides, almost bald in middle; scutellum usually conspicuously pale-haired but occasionally not (right); tail strongly downcurved (like sylvestris); pale markings buff rather than yellow.
