

Two Scottish nests of Osmia uncinata probably from the same female in the bark of a dead pine (Pinus sylvestris)

In both nests, the female entered the bark through an exit hole of Rhagium (1, 2) and excavated at the lateral margin of the beetle burrow (nest 1) and at the "roof" of the exit hole (nest 2), respectively, a burrow in upward direction containing four brood cells (nest 1) and one brood cell (nest 2), respectively.
