Great Yellow Bumblebee (*Bombus distinguendus*)

Background and Distribution

The Great Yellow Bumblebee (*Bombus distinguendus*) is probably the rarest of all the British bumblebees. Once distributed all over Great Britain, in the past 100 years it has contracted in range to the north and west of Scotland. Its main populations are on the Western Isles, Orkney, Coll & Tiree, and lowland Caithness, with small scattered centres in coastal Sutherland. The decline, particularly evident since 1960, is thought to be linked to increasing intensity of farming and other land use, resulting in a lack of the flowers essential for all bees to thrive. It is no accident that the greatest numbers are in areas of low-intensity crofting, where clovers, vetches and knapweeds are still plentiful.

Conservation

The Great Yellow is able to collect nectar from the deep flowers of Red Clover and Black Knapweed, two of its favourite food-plants. It will feed from a range of flowers, especially those in the pea, thistle and mint families. Its conservation requires a supply of suitable flowers right through the summer from May to September so that the nests produce the next generation of breeding bees. This usually means limiting grazing and cutting in summer, or practising appropriate rotation. Agricultural support schemes may be available to assist this.
